What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Kernel S&P Kensho Electric Vehicle Innovation Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Kernel Wealth Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Kernel S&P Kensho Electric Vehicle Innovation Fund invests in U.S. Listed companies involved in the electric vehicle sector and the industries supporting it. It is designed to track the S&P Kensho Electric Vehicles Index (NZD).

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Kernel S&P Kensho Electric Vehicle Innovation Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

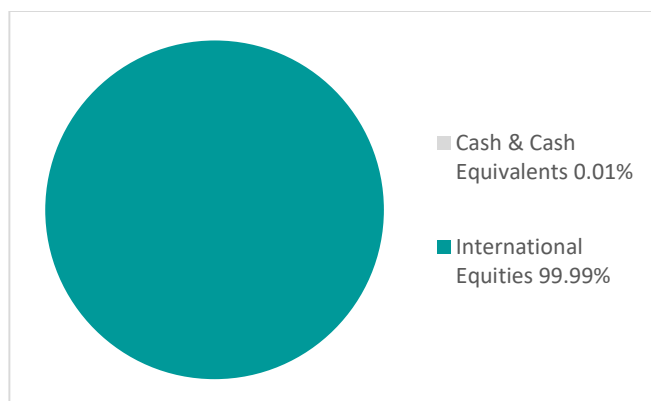
Example of how this applies to an investor

Emma had \$10,000 in the fund on 17 February 2021 and did not make any further contributions. On 30 September, Emma incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of \$1295.66 (that is -12.96% of her initial \$10,000). This gives Emma a total loss after tax of \$1350.44 for the period.

Notes
